Effect of respiratory physiotherapy in a patient with complete atelectasis of the left lung

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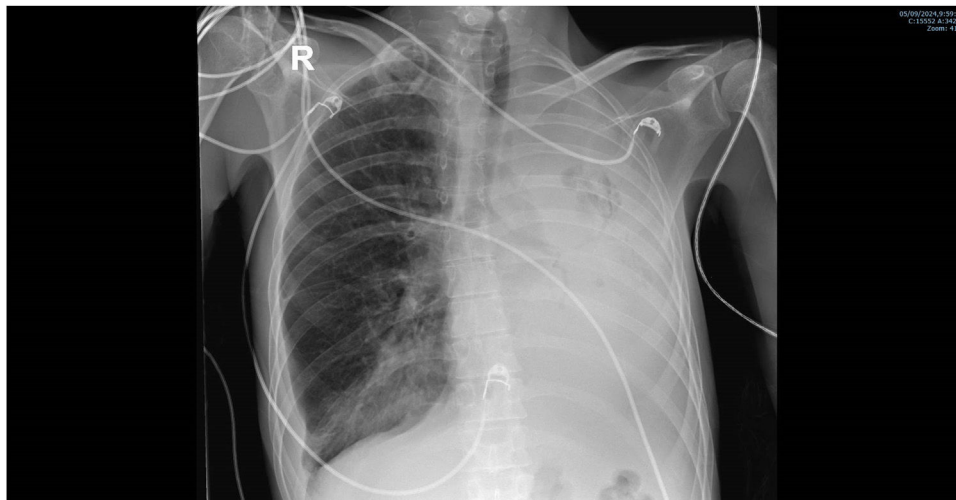

Our patient experienced clinical stagnation for 5 days due to complete atelectasis of the left lung. Non-invasive ventilation was alternated with high flow nasal cannula to maintain saturations at 90%. On the sixth day of clinical stagnation, the first respiratory physiotherapy intervention was performed. A pre- and post-radiological assessment was carried out. The recruitment of the left lung was clearly observed improving not only the radiological control but also the patient's symptoms and gasometric control, achieving $\text{PaO}_2/\text{FiO}_2$ values > 300 within 24 h. The respiratory physiotherapist's intervention had a significant impact on the patient's health, achieving the predefined goals prior to the session. Following clinical improvement, the patient was able to be transferred to their reference hospital within the next 48 h, shortening their stay in the ICU (Figs. 1 and 2).
